Uniform

We do appreciate and acknowledge that on days when the temperature is especially high, students may feel too hot. We would ask that students still come to school in their full school uniform during the Autumn and Spring Terms and we will take a common-sense approach, to removal of extra layers and notify students in morning registration.

We hope this approach is easy for students to understand and follow and will alleviate any issues. If students fail to wear the correct uniform, in line with our school policy, those students will be sanctioned appropriately. We hope there are very few incidents of this nature.

Please can you also encourage your child to bring a water bottle to school to keep hydrated during the school day. We ask that students fill their bottles before school, during break and during lunch.

We would like all students to be prepared for lessons and be ready to learn, this means ensuring they have the correct equipment in their pencil case and all the necessary books for each lesson and a positive attitude towards learning.

Our place in the community is one that we take great pride in and one that we should be grateful for. We are incredibly lucky to be surrounded by such a beautiful environment and it is important that we treat both this and members of the local community with respect.

Please kindly share this information with your child, as getting these simple things right, helps to reduce negative interactions/conversations and allows more time to spent on supporting students with their learning and progress. Parents support with all of these matters is greatly appreciated. A consistent focus on these every day standards will allow our students to engage fully with their learning and the make the best academic progress.

Important reminder for students in Year 10 and 12
